

Virginia Montañés (moderadora). Journalist, social anthropologist and naturopath. For more than two decades, she has worked as a researcher in the field of drug policy. He has coordinated the Study Commission for the Regulation of Cannabis in Andalusia (CERCA) and the ENCOD section in Spain. She currently runs the Centro Karissa comprehensive health center (centrokarissa.com) and is a regular contributor to *El Cultivador*.


The fight for cannabis regulation in Spain

At this table, the most representative proposals of the cannabis movement in our country will take center stage. Due to recent advances and the anomalous international circumstances, the current situation and the different perspectives for the future will be discussed.

Patty Amiguet (ConFAC). Cannabis activist, anti-prohibitionist and feminist. Graduated in Management and Finance and student of the degree in Social and Cultural Anthropology at UNED. Founder of the Pachamama Cannabis Association, president of CatFAC, co-founder of REMA and of the Cannabis Women member project and co-spokesperson of ConFAC. Currently, he works as the person in charge of dissemination and promotion of the RDR Cannabis project, a resource of the General Sub-directorate of Drug Addiction of the Generalitat de Catalunya that works to reduce the risks of cannabis use in cannabis associations.



Héctor Brotons (OECCC). CEO of Brotsanbert Abogados. Specialist in criminal, public health, human rights and cannabis policy. Defend cannabis social clubs across the state. Lawyer of Pannagh (acquitted in the Constitutional Court) and of the pardon of Albert Tio. Lawyer of the Guild of the Cannabis Industry. It has obtained licenses from the AEMPS. Defend industrial hemp and CBD companies. He writes popular and scientific articles, lectures, and has written five books on law and cannabis. Together with his team, he has defended more than a thousand cases. As an activist, he is a spokesperson for the OECCC.



Joseba del Valle (Regulación Responsable). Born in Bilbao and a journalist by profession, he began his career in cannabis activism in Barcelona in 2007, where he began to develop the model of cannabis social clubs in the hands of the historic association La Maca. After his return to Bilbao, he was part of the Pannagh board of directors, while he was the communication manager of the FAC. Since 2013, he has been the coordinator of the Renovatio Foundation, a non-profit organization dedicated to research and dissemination of studies and works related to the regulation of cannabis and drug policies in general. Since 2014, he has been the coordinator of the Responsible Regulation platform.



Gabriel Miró (moderador, GEPCA). Lawyer specialized in criminal law, associate professor at the University of Barcelona, professor in the Master's degree in Criminology at the University of Barcelona, subject "Drug Policies and Human Rights. Prohibitionism versus Regulation". Member of the Group for the Study of Cannabis Policies (GEPCA) and of the Observatory of the Penal System and Human Rights of the University of Barcelona (OSPDH).

E-cig: science and manipulation. Is electronic cigarette harmful to health?

A few months ago, we have attended a media campaign, promoted by the Government and supported by several scientific societies, aimed at raising public awareness about the risks of electronic cigarettes. While in other countries around us, e-cig is considered a risk reduction tool in smokers, in our country this instrument has been demonized. In the conference we will discuss and debate the causes of this phenomenon and offer objective and realistic information about the risks and benefits of using e-cig.



Fernando Caudevilla. Family doctor. Medicine Specialist. University expert in drug addiction. He combines his assistance activity as a family doctor in the Public Health Service, with different research, dissemination, training and direct patient care activities in fields such as chemsex, new drugs, crypto markets and therapeutic cannabis, among other fields.



Raúl del Pino (moderador). He studied Psychology at the UNED in the mid 90s since his great passion was the modified states of consciousness and psychedelics as tools of personal growth and transcendence. In 1996 he created the first website in Spanish dedicated to drugs. Since then he has been committed to informing, in a realistic and objective way, about the topic of psychoactive substances. He is currently responsible for the digital área of Feria del Cáñamo.

How the plant helps a deep connection with the inner being, to inspire us. It is a tool of consciousness and spiritual healing. Conscious and respectful use.



Mireia Berdún. Founder of La Encantada, a healing and spiritual retreat house in Castellterçol. She has been, since 2002, immersed in the knowledge of the spiritual and rituals uses of the master plants, especially with Holy Mary (*Cannabis sativa* L.). Mireia works with the Holy Mary in ceremonies of deep spiritual character, in order to maintain the state of attention and expansion of the heart, for reconnection with our higher purposes. Promotes careful, meditative and self-knowledge use of this sacred and healing plant.



Clara Sativa (moderadora). Graduated in journalism from the UCM, graduated from the Narco News México School of Authentic Journalism and a master's degree in Cinematography from the University of East London. Co-founder of Marihuana Televisión, Mujeres Cannábicas and REMA (State Network of Anti Prohibitionist Women), she has been informing and raising awareness about the world of cannabis and the war on drugs for almost a decade. She collaborates in different media and is co-creator and editor of the Documentary CANNÁBICAS, the first collective documentary of cannabis women in the world.

ICEERS Foundation: of policies against plants and the entourage effect

Policies against plants within the framework of the European Union and the United Nations

In this talk we will discuss the current development of drug policies in different European countries. We will mainly focus on plants such as cannabis, ayahuasca or kratom.



Maja Kohek. Doctor in Medical Anthropology and Global Health. He is investigating the contemporary ritual use in Catalonia of psychoactive plants (such as cannabis and ayahuasca) and their personal and social effects. He is currently investigating participation in ayahuasca ceremonies and its impact on public health in the Netherlands.

Beyond the entourage effect: effects of cannabis polypharmacology on human and ecological health

In this talk we will discuss the controversial concept "entourage effect" as well as analyze its potential benefits in terms of medicinal or environmental uses.



Genis Oña. Psychologist, doctoral student in Health, Psychology and Psychiatry and specialist in pharmacological research. Master in Sciences of the Central Nervous System and in Pharmacology, he did his dissertations at the Hospital de la Santa Creu i Sant Pau (IIB-Sant Pau), Barcelona, where he worked in phase I clinical trials involving the acute administration of psychoactive drugs, as well as experimental drugs for the treatment of neurodegenerative diseases. He is currently developing scientific research at ICEERS and at the Center for Research in Medical Anthropology (Rovira i Virgili University, Tarragona).

Comprehensive regulatory policy initiatives

In this block we will speak with two political representatives of parties that have carried out comprehensive regulation proposals: Más País and Unidas Podemos.



Lucía Muñoz (Unidas Podemos). Born in Palma in 1993. Graduated in Political Science from the Carlos III University of Madrid and a master's degree in International Cooperation from the Complutense University of Madrid. After finishing her studies, she returned to the island and worked as a project technician in an NGO until she stood in the general elections. She is currently a deputy in Congress, and among other responsibilities, she leads the issue of cannabis regulation in the Unidas Podemos parliamentary group.



Jorge Moruno (Más País). Sociologist and deputy in the Madrid Assembly for Más Madrid. At the Akal publishing house, he has published I don't have time. Geographies of Precariousness (2018) and The Entrepreneur Factory. Work and politics in the company-world (2015) ".



Bernardo Soriano (moderador). Law degree from the Complutense University of Madrid with a master's degree in Criminal Law from ICAM. He is a practicing lawyer and co-director of the S&F Law Firm, a firm specialized in matters related to cannabis in all its aspects. He has worked for the last twelve years in favor of the regulation of cannabis. He is the spokesperson for the Responsible Regulation Platform and has been the coordinator of the legislative design team and the drafter of the Proposal for the Comprehensive Regulation and Control of Cannabis in Adults Law, registered in the Congress by the Confederal Group of Unidas Podemos - En Comú Podem - Galicia en Común.

Óscar Parés. Graduate in Anthropology, Philosophy and Master in Drug Addiction. At the ICEERS Foundation, he coordinates educational and research projects in the field of cannabis and psychedelics.



Sarah Russo. Writer, researcher and creative director in the field of medicinal plants. He earned his degree in environmental studies from Evergreen State College. She is the founder of Herbs for the Apocalypse, a project to deepen connection to nature and build resilience.



Joan Manel Vilaseca. Graduated from film and audiovisuals, editor and professor of communication, he develops in parallel his interest in ethnobotany, phytochemistry, horticulture and sustainability. Collaborator of the ICEERS Foundation and initiatives related to education, research and harm reduction.


